The ingenuity and skill of tool making is well represented here by the likes of Norris, Spiers, Stanley, and credit is given to the development of steel making and how mass production made tools cheaper.

The design, layout, text and photography has been lovingly put together and printed on really thick paper making 528 pages quite a handful. The breadth and depth of this collection is extraordinary, each page has some marvellous item that must have taken hours of searching to find.

This inspiring book shows what's possible when you have a love and understanding of a subject that must be so dear to David Russell. It's for the serious tool collector or museum curator and I wonder how many will be available in our local libraries.
